

MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING HELD JUNE 14, 2004

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Miles. The clerk led the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes of the meeting held on May 3, 2004 were read and approved as presented. Bills were authorized for payment on Abstracts of Audited Vouchers #1, General Fund totaling \$51,885.48; #2, Water Fund totaling \$1,868.74; and #3, Sewer Fund totaling \$859.59. The treasurer's report for the months of March and April were approved subject to audit.

MANCHESTER FAMILY PARK

The bathrooms at the park were vandalized. Several attempts have been made to get the bathroom keys back from Shawn Pollock, President of Red Jacket Junior Baseball. He still has not returned the keys to the village. The Mayor asked the clerk to have Jeff Liberati change the locks on both bathroom doors and the park building door. The village will paint and clean the bathrooms. A motion was made by Trustee Johnsen, seconded by Trustee Folts and carried to charge a deposit of \$25.00 when a request is made to use the park bathrooms. The deposit will be returned after use if the bathrooms are found to be in order.

SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

Recreation Leader Robert Goodell submitted a proposed schedule for the summer park program. The Manchester Family Park will be open for park programs beginning Tuesday, July 6 until Friday, August 20, 2004. The program will run Monday through Friday 8:30 AM to 12:00 noon and 12:30 PM to 4:00 PM. The Villages of Manchester and Shortsville and the Town of Manchester will offer the summer swim program free of charge to Red Jacket School District Residents. Lessons will run Monday, July 19 through Friday, July 30. Registration cards must be filled out at the Manchester or Shortsville Village Hall prior to attending the swim program. Scheduled activities are Movies July 15, Water Park August 5, Field Day August 12, Park Picnic August 19

FREDERICK PROPERTY

No comments were received on the selection of the Village of Manchester as lead agency for the purposes of SEQR review for the Remediation Phase of the Environmental Restoration Project.

The following resolution was offered by Trustee Folts, seconded by Trustee Johnsen who moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Village of Manchester New York is lead agency for the purposes of SEQR review for the Remediation Phase of the Frederick Property Environmental Restoration Project, and

WHEREAS, there will not likely be a substantial adverse change in existing air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, traffic noise levels; or substantial increase in solid waste production; or substantial increase in potential for erosion, flooding, leaching or drainage problems that will occur from the Action, and

WHEREAS, there will not be a substantial adverse effect upon the environment caused by the removal or destruction of large quantities of vegetation or fauna; or a substantial interference with the movement of any resident or migratory fish or wildlife species; or adverse impacts on a significant habitat area; or a substantial adverse impact upon a threatened or

endangered species of animal or plant, or a habitat of such a species; or other significant adverse impacts to natural resources from the Action, and

WHEREAS, there will be no impairment of the character or quality of important historical, archeological, architectural or aesthetic resources or of existing community or neighborhood character due to the Action, and

WHEREAS, there will be no significant adverse change in the use of either the quantity or type of energy due to the Action, and

WHEREAS, there will be no hazard to human health due to the Action, and

WHEREAS, there will be no change in land use due to the Action, and

WHEREAS, growth, development and related activities are not likely to be caused by the Action, and

WHEREAS, no long term, short term cumulative or other effects are likely to be caused by the Action, and
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WHEREAS, there will be no impairment of the environmental characteristics of any Critical Environmental Areas as designated pursuant to subdivision 617.14(g) Of SEQR caused by the Action,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Manchester New York has determined that the proposed remedial phase of the Frederick Property Environmental Restoration Project will not have a significant environmental impact and a Draft Impact Statement will not be prepared.

The above resolution was put to a roll call vote which resulted as follows:

The resolution was duly adopted.

The Authorization Format naming Bruce E. Miles as the designated authorized representative of the Village of Manchester was completed by the clerk. Currently Philip D’Arduini is listed as the authorized individual. The Mayor signed the Environmental Restoration Program Applications, and the Full Environmental Assessment Forms. The clerk will return four copies of the executed Full EAF, Negative Declaration, Authorization Form and Resolution, and the NYSDEC Environmental Restoration Program Application to Sniedze Associates. They will then prepare a package for submittal to NYSDEC for funding.

On June 21 at 9:00 AM J. C. Auto, Jeff Liberati and the village laborers, Police Chief Bill Dean and Code Enforcement Officer Steven DeHond will go to the Ricci Estate at 57 State Street and remove the junk vehicles. The cost will be levied on the Village taxes in June.

PARK REVITALIZATION

Trustee Johnsen told the board she is researching grant money available for revitalizing the Manchester Family Park.

A motion was made and carried to transfer \$5,000.00 from A1990.4 to A8560.4.
