The Village crew has begun to pick up loose leaves from the curbside and will continue to do so until Friday, November 18th weather permitting. **The last day to place your loose leaves at the curb is Thursday November 17th**, after that all leaves will have to be bagged for pick up. **Please** remember to rake them near the curb, still on the grass, not in the road where they can block the flow of water drainage.

...AND PARKING Our snow local law goes into affect on November 1st until April 1st stating that **NO PARKING** is permitted on all village streets or over sidewalks between the hours of 2:00AM and 6:00AM. The reason for this is to allow the snowplow & sidewalk plow easy snow removal and safety for our drivers. Please note that the Village is not responsible for any damaged mailboxes or posts.
