FROM THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

POOL PERMITS

Please be advised that a permit is required for a swimming pool two feet high and over, including installation of an easy-set pool, all of which are regulated by building codes. Also, note that a fence is required for pools below forty-eight inches. The regulations for swimming pools require a "barrier" (a fence) that is 48 inches in height with certain rail and slat spacing or chain link of a certain size so that the children cannot climb over the fence.

Swimming pools are regulated because of the incidence of drowning of children under age 5, especially when the pool is unattended.
