SUMMARY OF PROJECTS FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Village of Manchester is having an industrious summer and continues to do so.

1. We have replaced sidewalks and will continue as budgeted. This is a long term goal to locate those sidewalks that need replacing or to add in locations that necessitate doing so. This will be ongoing through the years ahead.
2. After two failed attempts to receive a Parks and Recreation Grant, the village decided to budget improvements to the Manchester Family Park gradually on our own. This summer we have replaced the roof on the pavilion and installed a new "Tot Lot". We hope to purchase another piece of equipment in the 2007-2008 budget year.
3. The Route 21 Bridge Project is proceeding along. If you have any concerns, please let us know, as we have constant communication with the contractors to allow this project to run as smoothly as possible.
4. We have hired a contractor to renovate the Bandstand. This project is expected to be completed by this Fall.
5. Our work with the Community Development Block Grant continues with having six recipients for the 2nd Story Housing grants, and two Micro-Enterprising no interest loans. At this time, funding is still available for those interested in Micro-Enterprising and Capital Improvement loans. Call Laberge Group at (518) 458-7112 if you have an interest.
6. We are effectively moving forward on our TEP Grant for the "Manchester Gateway" Pedestrian/Bike Pathway along the outlet trail. We have interviewed various consultants and will be hiring a firm soon. We have appointed Christian Nill to act as Contract Administrator for this grant. Thank you to Mr. Nill for accepting this position.
7. Replacing a portion of the sewer line on South Avenue is scheduled for this summer.

If you didn't see the printed **Annual Drinking Water Quality Report** for 2006 in the Community News we have copies available here at the village hall for you to pick up.

Our **Summer Recreation Program**, located at the Manchester Family Park, off Merrick Avenue, on West Street, is in progress and will continue through August 24th. Stop at the park for details.
