The enclosed February 1st water & sewer statement is covering the last quarter of the year 2002. It is due by February 20th without penalty. All arrears and payments after Feb. 20th must be made by April 15th 2003, after which time we forward unpaid water & sewer to Ontario County to be levied upon property taxes. A reminder letter will be sent.



Though we have had a lot of snow so far this winter, the village crew has been working diligently keeping ahead of the snow removal. We have received many compliments for a job well done. They appreciate everyone's effort to keep their cars off the street though some are still parking in the road overnight. Please remember that cars must be kept off the streets from 2:00am to 6:00am (from November 1st to April 1st) to allow efficiency in snowplowing. We will be ticketing the offenders and have the car(s) towed away.

Please note that, by law, the Village is not responsible for replacing broken or damaged mailboxes. We certainly do not want to damage mailboxes, but unfortunately, it does happen. It is usually the weight of ice and snow that breaks them. If they do not extend over the curb, the plow itself won't touch it.

When removing snow from driveways & sidewalks, please check if the sidewalk has any ridges of excess snow. When this snow freezes it makes it difficult for pedestrians to get around it. Law prohibits snowplowing or shoveling snow from your property into the public streets.

We have received some complaints due to snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles using public streets, sidewalks, and walking trails. The Village has not designated any public land for their use, therefore it is against the law and your machine can be confiscated.
