REGULAR BOARD MEETING

The meeting was called order by the Mayor at 6:00 pm.

The minutes of the Regular meeting on July 1, 2024 were read. A motion was made by Trustee Henry, seconded by Trustee Fine, to approve the minutes, and carried.

The Treasurer's Report was not presented at this time. The clerk did request a transfer of \$1,341.33 from the Contingency A1990.04 to Refund Taxes A.1964.04. A motion was made by Trustee Henry to approve the transfer, seconded by Trustee Fine, voted on and carried.

Reported – LIBRARY BOX

The Free Library Box has been installed on the east side of the entrance to the village hall. It is reported it is well received and very active.

Reported – MANCHESTER RAILROAD MEMORIAL PARK – POMEROY SIGN

Plans are in progress to hold a dedication ceremony for The Pomeroy sign (NYS Marker) depicting the 1911 Train Derailment. The event will be held on the actual anniversary 113 years ago on 8/25/24 from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. Invitations will be sent.

Reported – FREDERICK PROPERTY- DAY ENVIRONMENTAL, INC.

A letter was received from Day Environmental Inc. for the annual site inspection. The site appears to be in good condition, and no actions are required at this time unless there are plans to alter the use. There are no plans at this time. No testing is required until August 2026.

The village will look into hiring a new village attorney.

- 1. Thank you from the school for the use of the Board room for regent testing.
- 2. Thank you from MMRA thanking the village for their support.
- 3. Ms. Lauren Fischer contacted the Mayor to voice her disapproval of the mowing down of the milkweeds along the trail. The milkweeds are so important to the continuance of the Monarch Butterfly. It upset her. The DPW did contact Ms. Fischer stating there needs to be a 12 ft clearing along the trail and they will take care the next time not to 'go overboard'.

DPW REPORT

- Chlorinator discussion and approximate cost. \$22,000 plus test pit is needed approx.
 \$2.000.
- According to the new Copper & Lead report all villages need to replace galvanized pipes and lead goose necks. All lead based. Testing stations will be needed also.
- The Health Dept said before getting quotes to paint the water tower, hire a diver to check out its condition.
- 35 Merrick Ave will be getting water and sewer hook up to the village. DPW will try to schedule next week.
- Sidewalks will be started on State Street soon.
- Can't locate Speed humps to purchase.
- Looking to purchase ramp for back door.
- A motion was made by Trustee Fine to proceed in the Chlorinator Project, seconded by Trustee Henry and carried unanimously.
- George Hotchkiss and Sean sheets are approved to attend Water School.
- UDIG charges \$2 for each non answered notification. Last bill was \$30. The Mayor wants this looked into.
- Trustee Henry asked about two cars in the village parking lot. A discussion followed, not action taken at this time.
- Discussed Utility/Salt building
- Discussed Howard Street
- Discussed repairing holes at 51 North Avenue
- Discussed Fencing around the DPW
- Discussed Canoe launch at end of trail at Route 96. The Mayor spoke with the property owner who said it was ok to use his portion of the property along with the easement that is there.

- No news on the grant that has been submitted for the roof and new masonry floor.

- The clerk handed out beneficiary forms for Interior firefighters for their Cancer Insurance Policies. They are to return them to her as soon as possible.
